

Ninth Circuit Nominee Pushed For School Mask Mandates, Claimed Kids “Will Be Hospitalized And They Will Die” Without Them: “That Is Not Hyperbole”

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KEY POINTS

- Joe Biden recently nominated Phoenix-based Democratic attorney Roopali Desai to the U.S. Court of Appeals to the Ninth Circuit. Last week, Desai painted herself as a moderate while appearing before the Senate Judiciary Committee. However, she has a long history of partnering with liberal groups and Democratic politicians. On at least two occasions, Desai worked with those liberal groups to undermine Arizona’s laws — all under the guise of “COVID-19.”

- In 2021, Roopali Desai was hired by the teachers union to oversee litigation that aimed to overturn Arizona’s ban on (1) schools mandating masks and COVID-19 vaccines and (2) local governments establishing vaccine passports. Desai claimed that, if the court allowed the state to ban school mask mandates, children “will be hospitalized and they will die ... That is not hyperbole.”

- In 2020, citing the risk of COVID-19, Roopali Desai filed a lawsuit on behalf of four liberal ballot initiative campaigns with the goal of allowing the campaigns to gather signatures online (instead of in-person). Allowing the campaigns to gather signatures online would made it much more likely that the liberal initiatives would have appeared on the November ballot, even though doing so was against the law. After the Arizona Supreme Court rejected the request in Desai’s lawsuit, her client accused the court of forcing people to “endanger their lives.”

- Less than one week after Roopali Desai filed her lawsuit in the ballot initiative case above, Democratic Secretary of State Katie Hobbs — one of her very close associate of

Desai — attempted to help Desai win the case by announcing that she would not oppose her request to allow the campaigns to gather signatures online. Desai is Hobbs's longtime attorney, was a member of her transition team, and has contributed to her campaigns. Hobbs is now one of the chief backers of Desai's nomination to the Ninth Circuit.

- Roopali Desai is close with other Democratic politicians as well. She has contributed nearly \$9,000 to Democratic candidates at the federal, state, and local (Phoenix) level, and her law firm has been paid more than \$230,000 by Democratic candidates at the federal level since 2014 (when she became Partner) alone.

Mask & Vaccine Mandates

Citing The Risk Of COVID-19, Roopali Desai Oversaw Litigation That Aimed To Overturn Arizona's Ban On Schools Mandating Masks And COVID-19 Vaccines:

In 2021, Roopali Desai filed a lawsuit on behalf of the teachers union and allied groups seeking to overturn Arizona's ban on schools mandating masks and COVID-19 vaccines. "The lawsuit filed by a coalition of school board members, educators, child welfare advocates and others contends that the same legal flaws in enacting the prohibition against masks also invalidates a host of other issues. These range from prohibiting schools from requiring vaccination against COVID-19 to banning the teaching of what has been labeled as 'critical race theory' ... Now Desai wants Cooper to void provisions in each of those bills that do not relate to the subject of the bill. For example, the provision prohibiting schools from requiring masks is within the 231-page HB2898, which is about 'appropriating monies, relating to kindergarten through grade twelve budget reconciliation.' - **The lawsuit also sought to overturn Arizona’s legislation that “bars local governments from establishing a ‘vaccine passport.’”** “But it also says that students cannot be required to be immunized to attend school that has only been given ‘emergency use authorization’ by the Food and Drug Administration. And it bars local governments from establishing a ‘vaccine passport’ or requiring proof of vaccination to enter a business.” (Howard Fischer, “Judge To Hear Arguments Over Legality Of Mask Prohibition,” [Capitol Media Services](#), 8/25/21)

Roopali Desai said that, without school mask mandates, “a great many children in Arizona ... will be hospitalized and they will die ... That is not hyperbole.” “One provision in the K-12 budget-related bill bars school districts from imposing mask mandates, a topic of heated public debate ever since school started in Arizona last month. Online Signature-Gathering

Citing The Risk Of COVID-19, Roopali Desai Oversaw Litigation That Aimed To Allow Liberal Ballot Initiative Campaigns To Collect Signatures Online:

In April 2020, citing the risk of COVID-19, Roopali Desai filed a lawsuit on behalf of four liberal ballot initiative campaigns with the goal of allowing those campaigns “to gather signatures online” instead of in-person. “Four ballot initiatives asked the Arizona Supreme Court for permission to gather signatures online, given the current challenge to collect during COVID-19 ... Attorneys Roopali Desai and Andy Gaona are representing the initiatives, and their suit names Secretary of State Katie Hobbs as the defendant since she’s the one who is ‘statutorily responsible for the creation and maintenance of the ‘E-Equal’ secure online signature collection system at the heart of this action.’” (Dillon Rosenblatt, “Initiative Backers Ask Court To Allow Online Signature Gathering,” [Arizona Capitol Times](#), 4/2/20)

- **Roopali Desai’s ballot initiative clients were (1) a campaign to legalize recreational marijuana, (2) a campaign to hike the state’s income tax, (3) a campaign to reform criminal justice laws, and (4) a campaign to repeal the state’s school choice program.** “The initiatives involved are Smart and Safe Arizona, the effort to legalize recreational marijuana; Invest in Education, a measure that proposes to tax the rich to fund public education; Second Chances, Rehabilitation and Public Safety, which is intended to increase public safety and reduce recidivism; and Save Our Schools, which is trying to put a cap on the number of students who would have access to the state’s Empowerment Scholarship Accounts program, among other provisions.” (Dillon Rosenblatt, “Initiative Backers Ask Court To Allow Online Signature Gathering,” [Arizona Capitol Times](#), 4/2/20)

- **The Arizona Supreme Court later issued an opinion stating that it would be unconstitutional to allow ballot initiative campaigns to gather signatures online.** “Voters in Arizona must sign petitions for ballot measures with a pen and paper, the Supreme Court said Friday, snubbing the idea of online signatures ... - **Roopali Desai claimed that “politics ended up winning the day,” and her client then blamed the Arizona Supreme Court for forcing people “to disregard facts and endanger their lives.”** “Roopali H. Desai, who represents the PACs, said she was disappointed but not surprised by the ruling. ‘We made a strategic decision to go directly to the Supreme Court as a first and last result,’ Desai told Law360. ‘While not surprising that politics ended up winning the day, it’s disappointing.’ Desai said that one backer for a petition regarding private school vouchers, Save Our Schools Arizona, suspended its campaign after the ruling rather than allow its all-volunteer staff to risk their health. ‘The Supreme Court’s ruling forces Arizona citizens who want to exercise their constitutional right to vote, their right to initiative and their right to free speech to disregard facts and endanger their lives,’ the group said in a statement.” (Abraham Gross, “Ariz. Democratic Secretary Of State Katie Hobbs — A Very Close Associate Of Roopali Desai — Refused To Contest Desai’s Lawsuit In The Ballot Initiative Case, Forcing Other (Republican) Parties To Intervene In Order To Stop Her Unconstitutional Request:

In April 2020, less than one week after Roopali Desai filed her lawsuit in the ballot initiative case, Democratic Secretary of State Katie Hobbs — listed as the ‘defendant’ in her official capacity as the head of elections — announced that she would not oppose Desai’s request to allow those campaigns to gather signatures online. “The state’s chief elections officer said she won’t oppose legal efforts to allow initiative drives to gather the remaining signatures they need online. Secretary of State Katie Hobbs said Monday that implementing the program in Arizona would not take much. She noted the E-Equal system already allows political candidates to ‘circulate’ nominating petitions online. ‘I think that in light of the circumstances that we’re in right now, it’s a reasonable request,’ she told Capitol Media Services. ‘We are certainly not opposing it and would hope for a quick resolution.’” (Howard Fischer, “Arizona Secretary Of State Not Opposed To Online Signatures,” [Capitol Media Services](#), 4/7/20)

- **Other (Republican) parties were then forced to intervene in the case as a result of Katie Hobbs’s announcement.** “Attorneys for the Republican-controlled Arizona Legislature already have sought to intervene in the case, though they have not yet filed paperwork detailing the position the GOP leadership seeks to take.
